Day 1

- 6 p.m. Arrive in Abilene, Kansas 'The First Cow Town of the West'
(Hotel assistance available)
- 6:30 p.m. Dinner at famous Brookville Hotel (\$16-\$22 pp) or Mr. K's Farmhouse (\$8-\$22)
- 8 p.m. Return to the hotel

Day 2

- 8 – 8:45 a.m. Breakfast at restaurants near the hotel
- 9 a.m. Driving Tour and group photo
Join your guide on a journey through the wildest and wickedest town in the Old West and learn about the inspiration for the phrase, 'The Real McCoy.'
- 10 a.m. Eisenhower Presidential Library Museum and Boyhood Home (\$9 pp)
Tour the boyhood home and museum of the 5-Star General and 34th President.
- 11:15 a.m. Travel to Newton, Kansas
- 12:15 p.m. Lunch in Newton
Enjoy a home-style meal in one of Newton's favorite restaurants, The Breadbasket. This family-owned café offers homemade bierocks and daily soup, salad and sandwich selections along with freshly baked pies and other desserts and has been serving the community for more than 30 years. The restaurant also features ample seating for large groups. (\$4.79 - \$ 9.89)
- 1:15 p.m. Kauffman Museum, Newton
Discover Chisholm Trail ruts, and learn about the Mennonite migration that followed the cattle trail. The well-defined ruts are accessible by a short, wooded paved path along Kidron Creek. Enjoy the award-winning Of Land and People exhibit, and a collection of Mennonite immigrant furniture, designated an official "Save America's Treasures" project. (\$4 pp)
- 2:30 p.m. Travel to Caldwell, Kansas
- 4:00 p.m. Arrive at the historic Opera House for drinks and entertainment
(Entire Caldwell package \$25 per person)
- 4:30 p.m. Visit Caldwell Museum & Brothel
- 5:15 p.m. Talking Tombstones
A cemetery tour featuring colorful history coming to life through characters that lived along the Chisholm Trail.

6:15 p.m. Opera House
Join the saloon girls for a catered dinner and entertainment.

7:30 p.m. Travel to Enid, Oklahoma

8:15 p.m. Arrive at hotel and check-in (Visit Enid to arrange group rate)

Day 3

Breakfast at the hotel – Be sure to dress for your movie role

9:45 a.m. Load up for your movie and a day of riding the trail

10 a.m. Cherokee Strip Regional Heritage Center
Tour the last remaining U.S. Land Office, and other historic buildings, as you feel part of ‘The Great Land Run’ of 1893. (\$5 pp)

11:30 a.m. Simpson’s Old Time Museum, Skeleton Creek Productions
Star in your own western movie with Stormy and Texas. No gunfights during lunch in the saloon. (\$30 pp)

2:30 p.m. Travel to Kingfisher, Oklahoma

3:30 p.m. Seay Mansion & Chisholm Trail Museum
Tour one of the first Governor’s Mansions ever built during the Oklahoma Territorial period. Built in 1892 of the Victorian style, visitors will enjoy a one-on-one Director’s tour. (\$5/\$4 senior)

5 p.m. Travel to Yukon, Oklahoma

5:30 p.m. Arrive at hotel and check-in (Yukon staff to assist with arrangements)

6:15 p.m. Dinner

Breakfast at hotel

10 a.m. Express Ranch, Yukon
Meet the rare and beautiful black and white Clydesdales. These gentle giants typically stand around 18 to 19 hands high and weigh nearly a ton. They’re beautiful, graceful, and extremely even tempered. (free of charge for tours)

11:30 Depart for Fort Reno, Oklahoma

- 12 Noon Fort Reno, Oklahoma
 Fort Reno has a long and diverse history from its inception during the Indian Wars to its service during the Oklahoma Land Run. During WWII, it was used as a Remounting station and a German Prisoners of War Camp. Enjoy lunch on the grounds.
 National Cavalry Competition – Thundering hooves, gleaming sabers and the call of the bugle charge return to the parade grounds as competitors from around the world join in this annual event sponsored by the U.S. Cavalry Association.
 (Dates of competition: Sept. 19-24, 2016 and Sept. 18-23, 2017, Day tickets available)
 Step-on Guide available for tour of the grounds, with stops along the way at the historic buildings and the Cavalry Museum. (Fort Reno \$2 adult/\$1 senior, Cavalry Museum by donation)
- 1:30 p.m. Depart for Chickasha, Oklahoma
- 2:30 p.m. Grady County Museum
 Refreshments and unique downtown shopping within a short walking distance. (\$5 pp)
- 4pm Depart for Duncan, Oklahoma
- 5pm Arrive at hotel for check-in, dress for dinner (Duncan CVB to assist with rooms)
- 6:30 p.m. Chisholm Trail Heritage Center
 Enjoy a relaxing evening on the Chisholm Trail. Group will be met by one of our professional tour guides. Tour includes the 4D experience theater where you actually feel the rumble of the stampede; all in air-conditioned comfort. Guests will receive a cowboy dinner around the campfire with live entertainment. (\$35 pp)
